

## Alberta Small Employer OHS Legislated Requirements

**Industry Code: 31508**  
**Overhead Cranes – Service only**

**This document is a guideline only.** Employers have a responsibility of assessing all applicable occupational health and safety legislation, for the tasks they are performing.

The type of cranes referred to operate electrically, hydraulically or manually and run overhead on tracks or beams - usually in a long bay of a warehouse, fabrication facility and yard, or operating plant (water, oil/gas, etc).

Task description	Type of equipment used and workers employed
Overhead cranes operate inside buildings to move product from one stage of production to another. The cranes may also run outside on supported tracks to pick up stock piles of material.	Service personnel will use a ladder, scaffold, or elevated work platform to service the cranes.  Some cranes are built with a cat walk attached to the mast for easy access.
Servicing involves electrical repairs. However, mechanical repairs such as replacing worn out bearings or wheels are common.	hand tools, lubricants and inspection penetrants (chemical spray).
