The Myths & Misunderstandings of Fall Protection Presentation Details

Fall protection systems have become a common safety tool on industrial, commercial and residential worksites. Today, workers can be seen using specifically designed fall safety equipment and specialized systems to protect themselves while working at height. While these solutions are an excellent step towards improving worker safety, there are times when workers and other site personnel may lack the proper understanding of these fall protection systems and may put themselves at an increased risk of an incident. Some common misunderstandings include failing to understand the concept of limiting or calculating free fall distance, believing the use of carabiners is dangerous, or assuming that calling 911 will provide the necessary rescue of a suspended worker in a fall arrest system.
