







Pre-Task	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An employer must have a written code of practice when workers enter or work in a confined space. • Confined space workers must be competent prior to entry. • Complete a hazard assessment specific to the confined space and follow the required controls. • A valid entry permit is to be posted outside the entrance of the confined space. • Complete the permit requirements such as but not limited to purging, ventilation, and gas testing prior to entry. • The safety watch, tending worker or monitor should be present outside the confined space prior to worker entry. • Ensure appropriate emergency response procedures, including alarm procedures, are in place and communicated with workers, and emergency equipment is readily available.
During	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Never enter a confined space without authorization or if unsure if it is safe. Confirm entry and exits prior to entry. A worker must not enter or remain in a confined space unless an effective rescue can be carried out. • Continuous air quality monitoring may be required. • Never stay in a confined space when asked to leave or required to evacuate. A competent worker must have a suitable system for summoning assistance. • Only remain in the confined space while following the permit requirements. Only complete approved tasks for confined space entry.
Post-task	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unnecessary personal should not remain within the confined space. Exit the confined space upon task completion, prior to the expiration of the permit or when ordered to exit. • Clean area and remove tools, equipment, or materials that you brought in following specific procedures. • Always confirm with the tending worker or monitor that you have exited the confined space.
