



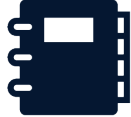



Pre-Task	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consider the task and follow safe job procedures, industry best practices, and legislative requirements. • Complete a hazard assessment and follow controls. • Utilities must be located through Alberta Utility Safety Partners (formerly One-Call) prior to ground disturbance. • Confirm the pin placement. • Follow necessary Ground Disturbance Permits. • Consider prevailing wind direction, adjacent land use and topography, geometry of the road being impacted, and the amount of snow to be controlled in the area to ensure proper height, length, quantity, staging and location of the fence. • Use all required PPE. • Inspect all equipment and ensure it is in good working condition.
During	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use a buddy system when moving heavy rolls. • Ensure the rolls are blocked and prevented from rolling while being transported and placed. • Use a post pounder to drive in T-bar posts. • Practice good housekeeping. • Ensure to stand on the post side while securing in case of wire break.
Post-task	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure all post holes are refilled when posts are removed. • Ensure snow fence is secured appropriately.
